MODELS - KS2



All: Here come the models
Down the middle of the
catwalk,
Here come the models
Down the middle of the line,
New York, Paris,
Milan and London...

Models:
What a creation!
And looking fine!



- GROUP:** Whole class or smaller number, in pairs
- AIM:** To provide opportunities for individuals to sing and create interesting movement sequences
- PROPS:** None
- GAME/RULES:** The children stand opposite a partner, forming two facing lines with a walkway between them (ie. the 'catwalk') which should be wide enough for two children to pass side by side. Decide which end of the line is the 'top' of the catwalk.
- Pairs of children, starting with the top pair, take it in turns to walk down the catwalk, posing as they go. They stop at the bottom of the catwalk to sing their solo lines, and then join on the end of their respective lines. The next pair at the top then take their turn to travel down.
- Encourage the children to use spins, turns, high and low actions, joint actions with their partner if they wish, interesting ways of walking, good posture, trendy poses etc! Have fun!

THE BALLOON GAME - KS1



Balloon! Balloon!
Fly up to the moon!
And as you go
Please give us a tune!
Will it be short?
Will it be loooong?
Let's all listen
To your song!

(Balloon is released, children listen, then copy the sound they hear!)

A loooong song!
...But you didn't reach the moon!
Maybe next time,
You silly balloon!

- GROUP:** Whole class or smaller group
- AIM:** To create short and long sounds with voices - a riotous game!
- PROPS:** Balloons, including long, party balloons that will fly about and make a funny long sound, and smaller round balloons that will make shorter sounds. Best played in the hall or outdoors!
- GAME/RULES:** All children learn the chant. They sit in a circle and a selection of balloons are placed in the middle. A child chooses a balloon. As the teacher blows it up, the children sing the first two verses. After the word "song", the balloon is released. The child that chose it tries to catch it (being as careful as possible - establish boundaries!). While the balloon is flying, the other children listen to the sound it makes. They immediately imitate the sound with their voices. Was it a long or short sound? Whichever they decide, the word 'long' or 'short' is added to the final verse which all of the children sing as the balloon is brought back to the pile in the middle. And the game continues!
